BNE: US President George W. Bush arrived in Brussels, Belgium a few hours ago at the start of a 5-day visit to Europe. Thousands of **protestors** greeted him amid unprecedented levels of security. His **mission** is to repair the transatlantic ties that were damaged throughout Mr. Bush's first term of office. This is his first European tour since being **elected** for a second term as president. Talks this week will be rather delicate. He meets with French President Jacques Chirac, and German Chancellor Gerhard Schroeder, both of whom vehemently **opposed** Bush's decision to attack Iraq. Mr. Bush will meet more than two-dozen European leaders, including his **trusted** ally Tony Blair. He will be pushed on issues as diverse as why America refuses to sign up to the Kyoto Protocol and the International Criminal Court, Iran's suspected nuclear weapons programme, **lifting** the embargo on sales of arms to China, the Middle-East, and of course the War on Terror.

In a speech given before his visit, Mr. Bush stressed the **importance** of repairing relations, "to seize the moment and invigorate a relationship that is a vital relationship for our own security, as well as a **vital** relationship for long-term peace in the world." He **outlined** his own agenda, "I'll talk about a variety of areas where we can work together; talk about the greater Middle East, middle eastern peace and Iraq and Iran; talk about the **need** for us to work together to feed the hungry and take care of the diseased; I'll talk about the environment". European leaders, however, are hoping for a little more than just talk from Mr. Bush. He also wants to focus on the common bonds that the USA and Europe share, "We do not accept a **false** caricature that divides the Western world between an idealistic United States and a cynical Europe. America and Europe are the **pillars** of the free world."
