THE ARTICLE

"Naked sushi" banned in China

BNE: The Chinese government has banned restaurants from serving sushi and sashimi on the bodies of naked women. The *Beijing Times* reports that authorities issued the ban because the practice represented an insult to people's "moral quality" and might encourage the development of an unsavory commercial culture. China's Department of Commerce stated the practice was a violation of common decency as well as being unhygienic and an infringement of women's rights. The ban also extends to the use of nude models in stores to promote business goods.

The new law is reportedly in response to complaints from residents in the city of Kunming, in southwest China. Citizens were offended that a restaurant served sushi on nude female university students. The restaurant had built up a large clientele: it charged \$120 per meal and required reservations three days in advance. The owner and head chef claims he was promoting the traditional Japanese art of *nyotaimori*, which uses a woman's naked body as a serving platter. There are no reports of whether *nantaimori*, eating from men's bodies, is included in the recent ban.
