He said: "We...need to limit the crowd for safety reasons. We have had a problem for the past eight or 10 years. The Tomatina is not controlled. We don't know how many people are going to come." The festival began after the end of WWII. There are many reports about its origins. Some people say a fight between teenagers near a vegetable market ended up with the youths throwing tomatoes at each other.
